

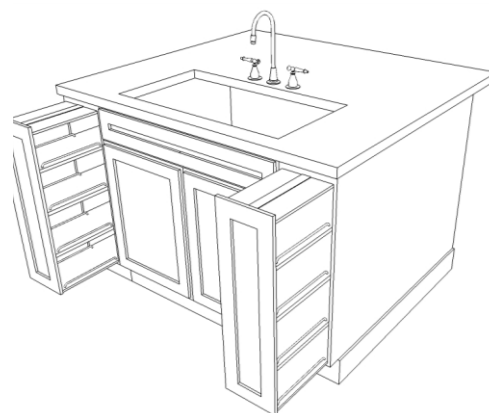
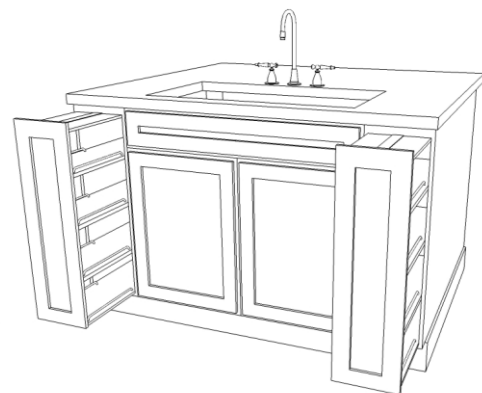
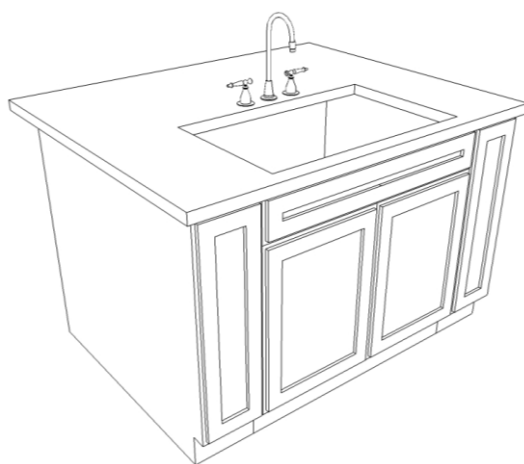


KITCHEN ISLAND WITH SPICE RACK

The kitchen island doesn't just have to be for extra seating or more work space, and this design proves it. By adding some creative spice rack storage, you can have easy access to all your spices, cooking supplies, or even canned goods. The design in the picture has a sink in the island, but you could always put in a cook top as well. This island only has cabinets on one side, but you can always put base cabinets back to back or put wall cabinets on the other side.

Supplies You Will Need from the RTA Cabinet Store

- ✓ Two 9" base cabinets (with full height doors)
- ✓ Two AX448BC5C Rev-A-Shelf Pull-Out Base Organizers
- ✓ One 30" sink base
- ✓ Two Island panels
- ✓ One island panel
- ✓ One piece of toe kick
- ✓ One piece of outside corner molding

Instructions to Build a Kitchen Island with Spice Rack

Step 1: Install Sink Base Cabinet.

Step 2: Install the two 9" base cabinets next to the sink base. Secure the face frames together for a tight fit.

Step 3: Remove the doors from the 9" base cabinets, and install the pull out organizers. Secure the doors to the front of the pull-out organizers.

Step 4: Use the island panel to cover up the back of the base cabinets.

Step 5: Cut the toe kick to length to cover up the bottom front of the base cabinets.

Step 6: Cut the outside corner molding in half and secure to the back edges of the base cabinets, covering up where the island panel edge meets the sides of the base cabinets.
